Used correctly, benchmarking against national data sets can be an effective method of self-evaluation for schools and multi-academy trusts (MATs).

It allows senior leaders to compare their performance and administrative processes against other schools and MATs with similar characteristics nationally, helping to identify any opportunities for improvement.

Why bother to benchmark?

The aim of benchmarking is to provide the senior leadership team with external criteria against which they can measure their own school or MAT.

It allows leaders to ask:

- How well are we doing compared to others?
- How good do we want to be?
- Who is doing it the best?
- How do they do it?
- How can we adapt what they do to our institution?
- How can we continue to outperform?
- Where are we on our school improvement journey compared to others?

If data is used intelligently, benchmarking can provide valuable insights which can lead to the sharing of best practice nationally.

Here, an example might be using the data to compare pupil outcomes by looking at the performance of different pupil groups at similar schools/MATs — say, girls vs boys, EAL vs non EAL or pupil premium vs non pupil premium.

Benchmarking provides the right evidence so you can ask the right questions of partner/other schools, e.g. "How did you close the gender gap?", "How did you engage with your EAL pupils to close the gap with other pupils?".

What types of national data sets are available?

A wide range of national data is currently available for academies and local authority led schools and colleges. This includes:

- Pupil attainment & progress
- Statutory assessments
- Public examinations
- Ofsted ratings
- Attendance
- Authorised and unauthorised absence
- Rate of exclusions
- Pupil data re local socio-economics
- Workforce & Finance
- MAT/Sponsors performance

The government website https://www.compare-school-performance.service.gov.uk/ is easy to navigate and gives performance tables for primary, secondary and special needs schools and colleges in England. MAT comparison tables can also be downloaded.

Who should you compare yourselves against?

Looking at schools/MATs with similar characteristics will provide the best insights. Some leaders might want to look at schools from an area that they know is similar to their own. As well as location, other similarities might include pupil premium ratio/SEN ratio/EAL ratio/Free School Meals/area of deprivation characteristics. These can be filtered out to allow for direct comparisons.

How can you effectively scrutinise different levels of school & MAT data?

Analyse School Performance (ASP) is the DfE's system for reporting school performance data. It is an analytical service, via a secure DfE sign in, which allows senior leaders to compare recent results against national benchmarks. However, the data is high level and there is limited ability to further drill down to find out more. For MATs, this means they are not able to begin contextual conversations with the full picture and need to get further evidence directly from the school.

For the best outcome, we advise many of our clients to invest in a suitable data analytics tool which will allow them to quickly spot patterns and trends, allowing for interventions to be put swiftly in place.

In the case of MAT accountability, senior leaders won't be able to ask the relevant questions if they can't see comparable data across *all of their schools*. A single matrix is always preferable. This triangulates the data to understand the impact of one benchmark on another. E.g. staff absence—does it have an impact on performance of a Year 11 pupil? Lesson cost—how much do they cost from one academy to another and is this cost effective?
